Are you being charged by your trust to stay on site for non-resident on calls because you feel you are not a safe distance away from the hospital to complete your on call? A number of hospital trusts have been charging urology registrars for on call rooms. BSoT is committed to challenging this and with the help of the BMA we are setting up a national campaign.
