BRITISH ASSOCIATION OF UROLOGICAL SURGEONS

THE Thirteenth Annual General Meeting was held at the Royal College of Surgeons, Lincoln's Inn Fields, London, W.C.2, on Thursday, 27th June 1957, at 9.30 A.M.

The President, Mr R. H. O. B. Robinson, was in the Chair.

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 28th June 1956 were read and signed as correct.

Report of Council for 1956-57.—The report of the Council for 1956-57, which had been circulated, was received and adopted.

Report of the Honorary Treasurer and Balance-Sheet to 31st December 1956.—The audited accounts for the year 1956, which showed a surplus on the year's working of £152. 12s. 1d., were presented by the Honorary Treasurer and approved.

Election of Members of Council.—The following were elected members of Council to fill the vacancies: Mr T. J. Millin, Mr R. A. Mogg, Mr D. S. Poole-Wilson.

Election of Auditors.—Messrs Howard, Howes & Co. were re-elected auditors for the ensuing year.

1958 Annual Meeting.—The President reported that the 1958 Annual Meeting would be held in London on 19th, 20th, and 21st June. He stated that the Council had decided that the subject for the main discussion should be "Carcinoma of the Prostate" and not "Cancer of the Bladder" as originally planned.

1959 Annual Meeting.—The President reported that the 1959 Annual Meeting would be held in Glasgow and that the main discussion would be on "Hydronephrosis."

Abstracts of Papers read at Meetings.—Mr J. Grieve had suggested that abstracts of papers to be read at meetings should be issued to members. After discussion it was decided to take no action about this.

The Annual Dinner was held at the Royal College of Surgeons in the evening and was attended by 117 members and their guests.
