- 1. Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 15th June 1961, which had been circulated, were taken as read and signed as correct.
- 2. INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF NEPHROLOGY

The Second International Congress of Nephrology will be held in Prague, Czechoslovakia, from 25th to 29th August 1963, under the sponsorship of the International Nephrological Society and the Czechoslovak Nephrological Society. A session on renal physiology will be held, organised as a set of Symposia concerning important recent problems. The programme will include round-table discussions on transport phenomena, the kidney in pregnancy, chronic pyelonephritis, renal hypertension, and dialysis treatment of chronic renal failure.
