UROLOGICAL PRIZE ESSAY, 1970

THE British Association of Urological Surgeons offers a prize of £100 for an essay on A subject of the candidate's own choice within the urological field.

REGULATIONS

Candidates for the prize must be Fellows of one of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons in the British Isles, Canada, Australasia or South Africa who are in the course of urological training or who have obtained consultant posts within ten years of the date of submission of the essay.

The length of the essay should be a minimum of 10,000 words. It must be typewritten and in English.

Each essay must bear the name and address of the author. The substance of an essay already accepted for a university thesis, but not previously published, may be submitted.

Three assessors will be appointed by the Council to make recommendations on the award of the prize, which will be decided at the B.A.U.S. Council meeting. The Council reserve the right not to make an award in any one year.

The closing date for the receipt of the 1970 prize essay will be January 1st, 1970. The assessment will be made by March 1st and the winner will be required to present a summary of his essay at the Annual Meeting of the Association where the prize will be presented. The British Journal of Urology will have the option of publishing the winning essay in full or in summary before publication is made elsewhere.

NOTE.—A prize will be offered for an essay every year. The subject of the essay will be in one year a set topic and in alternate years on any matter of the candidate's choosing within the urological field. Candidates for the latter should submit their title for approval to the President, before the essay is written.
