BRITISH ASSOCIATION OF UROLOGICAL SURGEONS

THE TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING was held at the Royal College of Surgeons, Lincoln's Inn Fields, London, W.C.2, on Thursday, 26th June 1969.

The President, Mr A. W. Badenoch, was in the Chair.

- 1. Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 27th June 1968, which had been circulated, were taken as read and signed as correct.
- 2. - 3. Report of Council for 1968-69.—The Report of Council for 1968-69, which had been circulated, was received and adopted.

Several members expressed their concern regarding the training programme.

It was pointed out that much urology was done by surgeons not specially trained in accordance with the scheme suggested by the Association. Concern was felt for the future urological training of this group of surgeons. There was a considerable body of opinion who felt that this topic should be discussed with some urgency and it was agreed to make time for this at the One-Day meeting in Northampton.

The view was also expressed that Associate Members should be represented in the administration of the Association.

- 4. Report of the Honorary Treasurer and Balance Sheet to 31st December 1968. The audited accounts for the year 1968, which showed a surplus on the year's working of £971, 12s. 2d., were presented by the Honorary Treasurer and approved.
