

## MSc and DIPLOMA in UROLOGY

The re-structured format for the MSc and Diploma in Urology offers flexible options for students: it can be taken 2 years part-time; or 4 years part-time; or up to 5 years modularly.

Students need to complete 8 taught modules to gain a Diploma, with an additional research module culminating in a research based thesis to gain the MSc award. The taught modules are:

- 1) Basic Science in Urology (embryology, anatomy, physiology)
- 2) Research Methodology and Statistics in Urology
- 3) Urological Oncology
- 4) BPH and Bladder Dysfunction
- 5) Gynaecological Aspects of Urology
- 6) Urological Imaging and Calculi
- 7) Emergency and Paediatric Urology
- 8) Andrology and UTI.

This programme offers a clinical theory, science & research-orientated programme of teaching which aims to give an understanding of the scientific basis of the specialty, the importance of laboratory research and the use of research methods and how to apply them.

It comprises on-site all-day teaching on Fridays consisting of lectures, seminars and tutorials, along with an additional research-based module for the MSc option.

Closing date for applications: 30th July each year

The programme is open to candidates who hold a medical degree which is accepted by the General Medical Council for practice in the UK, and who have passed the Clinical Surgery in General component of the MRCS examination (or equivalent). Some clinical experience in Urology is desirable but not essential.
